Science Week

Myrtleford P12 used Science Week to kick off our new partnership with the Victorian Space Science Education Centre (VSSEC). As part of this partnership, the school was gifted class sets of water rockets and programmable satellites. We were also given an optical telescope. VSSEC spent a day with us to both train our staff and run these activities with our students.

Water Rockets

A range of our classes from Years 8 to 10 participated in the water rocket activity. Emma from VSSEC expertly guided our students to construct a variety of different rockets. They were required to hypothesise which features would help their rocket travel the furthest. After construction was the fun part – taking the rockets out to the oval for launch.

CanSAT satellites

The Year 9-10 STEM class spent the day with Mark from VSSEC. In this section, students used their understanding of the Engineering Design Cycle to construct a small satellite. Mark gave very little guidance in the construction of the satellite (on purpose – of course) and challenged the class to use trial and error to successfully complete their satellite. All groups completed this task in record time.





After a short break, students were tasked with coding their satellite. This enabled the satellite to collect temperature, air pressure and altitude data after launch. After a practice launch and a few coding corrections and alterations, our satellites were ready for launch.

We headed out to the oval, set up an enormous launch zone and used a specially designed drone to launch our satellites. One by one, each satellite was taken up 120m into the sky before being dropped. As the parachute opened, the satellites collected our data.

Astronomy Night

We were very lucky to have a mostly clear night to run our first Myrtleford P12 Astronomy Night. In collaboration with the Fathering Project, we ran a sausage sizzle before a short presentation from Emma and Mark and a telescope viewing. The evening was very well attended (so much so, we ran out of sausages!). Once the telescope was set up, the sky darkened and we set our sights on the Moon. The telescope was excellent quality,



making it very easy to view the seas and craters of the moon. As the night went on, we turned our sights towards Saturn. Although it was small, we were able to view the rings and some of the moons of Saturn. This was definitely the highlight for many.

A massive thankyou to our resident DJ, Rian Minaar. Rian is a Year 9 student and with very little warning, set up his decks and hosted a very fun disco at the Astronomy Night.






YEAR 9/10 PSYCHOLOGY




Making abstract art...

Alpine L2P is looking for learners!

Did you know, the Alpine L2P Program just celebrated more than 10 years of delivery and we are proud of the fact the we have supported 128 learners to get their P plates.

Over the last 3 years, our L2P program has faced some challenges, from bushfires to a pandemic, causing a suspension of the program, retirement of mentors and learners found other ways to get their hours.

In the past 6 months, Alpine L2P have focused on increasing our mentor numbers across the Shire, so we can support more youth the get their P plates. That focus has paid off and we now have 10 additional mentors, so we are now looking for learners.

So, if you are having trouble getting your 120 hours and need some assistance, this is the program for you. There is eligibility requirements but we look at each learner on an individual basis, so just ask.


