- sharing information online

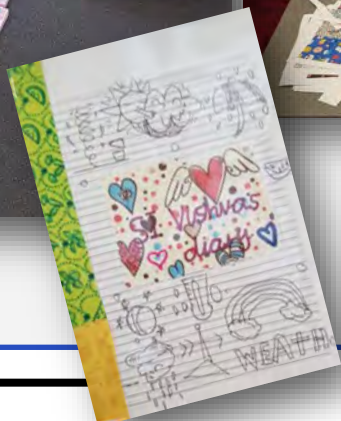


## LIBRARY NEWS

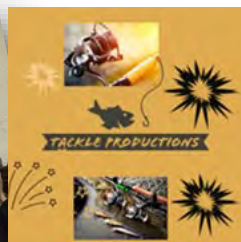
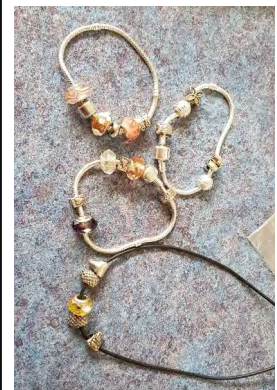


## Rhinestones

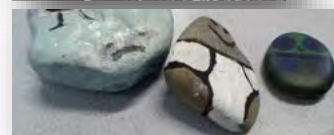


We are **Tackle Productions** and we are selling lures.

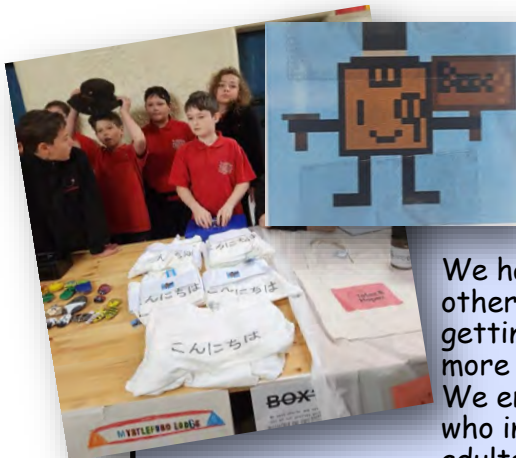
Before we arrived at the Beechworth Gaol we were nervous about how many people were going to come to our Social Enterprise and if it might get overwhelming.

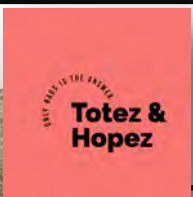

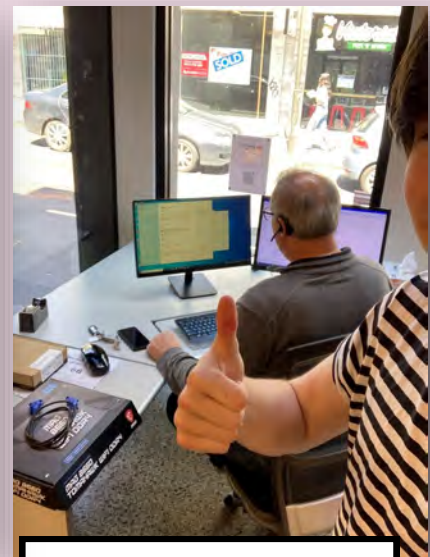

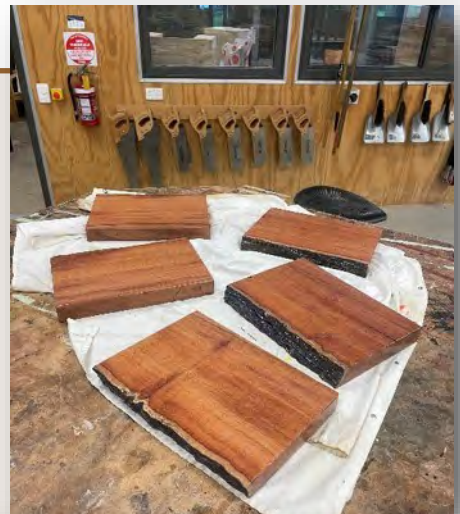

All groups had to “give back” to the community and donate 10% of profits to a charity. This money will be going to Black Dog Institute Australia to support mental health research and programs.

- Taylah, Connor, Declan, Will and Nick made candles in repurposed mugs from the Myrtleford Op shop. They learned the importance of marketing properly to sell more products as they made just over \$7 to split between 5 group members.



- Jess provided the teachers with a service to keep them caffeinated and happy by delivering Ruby’s Cafe coffee for a fee. She made over \$30 profit for just three days of recess deliveries.

- Tyler and James flipped a beautiful set of bedside drawers to the customer’s design brief and made \$80 profit. Tyler is now enlisting the help of Byron to get another set of drawers ready for sale in the next couple of weeks, so stay tuned.



- Kaidan, Nathan and Cam made platters from red gum that had fallen in Cam’s yard. A clever choice as they only had to purchase food grade lacquer. This made their profit margin large with \$200 sales for the five boards.

# Year 11 PSYCHOLOGY

This week in Year 11 Psychology students participated in multiple taste experiments to support their understanding of their current topic “What influences a person’s perception of the world?” involving vision and gustation (taste).

We investigated whether colour impacts the perception of flavours through tasting dyed drinks. The hypothesis was supported as the colour of drinks tricked some students; red drink had reports of ‘creamy soda, fanta, raspberry’, the lime drink had reports of ‘pine lime, lime and lemon lime’ and the brownish colour had reports of ‘cola and Lime’. However, many students correctly guessed that all drinks were the same flavour and Miss Baker had in fact used the same drink (lemonade mixed with a bit of apple juice) and dyed them different colours.

## Does COLOUR affect taste?

One of the most significant influences on flavour judgment is our expectation of how food should look. Colour tends to be the single most important visual cue when it comes to our expectation about the likely taste and flavour of food (Spence, 2015). We start to associate specific colours with various types of foods and drinks during childhood and link them to certain tastes and flavours throughout life. For example, we expect yellow pudding to have a banana or lemon flavour and brown pudding to have a chocolate flavour.



1. Take one drink of each colour.
2. Write down what each flavour is.
3. Once revealed, write in the correct flavour.

Students also explored the impact branding has on the perception of flavour. Normally, most believe popular brands are better tasting. However, after doing a blind taste test home-brand chips and lolly snakes were preferred to the well known versions. Investigate yourself and potentially save some money!




Then students created a ‘Tongue Map’ of where the five tastes were the most sensitive in their mouth using cotton buds dipped in:

- Sugar solution for sweet
- Salt solution for salty
- Lemon juice for sour
- Strong coffee for bitter and
- Tabasco sauce for spicy
