Myrtleford Outer School Hours Care (OSHC)









Myrtleford Outside School Hours Care provides care after school and during the school holidays. We also provide care during pupil free days (subject to demand).

Our aim is to provide a safe, caring, happy environment, where the children feel at home

Our service operates from the portable building, within the St Mary's primary school grounds. Our building has two rooms, the main room is for art/craft, home corner, sensory space, board games, construction and STEM. The second room is the quiet space, where the children can relax and read a book, listen to audio books with headphones or watch a movie after a long day at school.

We have access to the school oval, playground and basketball court.

The children are involved with program planning for OSHC and vacation care. Their ideas are an important part of our service.

We highly value our relationships with families, and we will collaborate with families about aspects of the program

An afternoon snack is provided and a water station is available daily


