Good Arguments:

Objection Your Honour!



Mock Trial – Director of Public Prosecutions vs Tucker Barbaro (2023)

Students of the Year 9/10 elective *Good Arguments: Objection Your Honour* prepared for and participated in their first mock trial of the unit.

Students were grouped into the prosecution and defence and worked in small teams to prepare for the trial. They had to compile opening and closing statements, as well as questions for the witness examination-in-chief and the cross-examination.

Prior to the trial, students learnt about the elements required to convict someone of murder and possible defences. They learnt about causation, as well as the concepts of *mens rea* (the guilty mind) and *actus reus* (the guilty act).

The jury was selected from a junior class of Year 8 students, who actively listened and decided on the ultimate verdict: Not Guilty.



Some notable performances include Zeke Menz for maintaining composure and not cracking under the ruthless cross examination performed by the fearless Alex Cameron. All barristers and witnesses performed exceptionally well. Molly Knobel also presented a harrowing cross-examination of the accused. The tipstaff, performed by Archer Novak, managed to stay in character for the entire trial and controlled the proceedings flawlessly.

This experiential learning opportunity combined both knowledge of the law with literacy. It also increased student confidence with presenting in front of their peers. Students engaged positively with the activity and have deepened their understanding of legal processes.

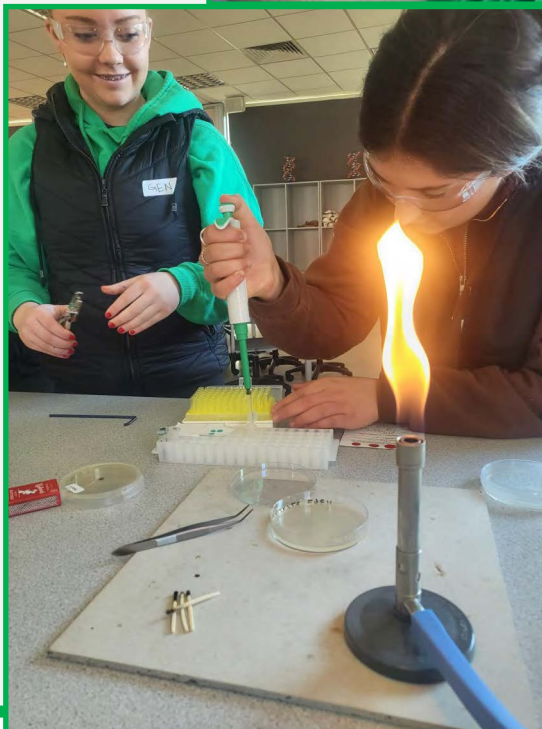
Unit 2 Biology Melbourne Camp

Students had the opportunity to work on case studies, meet scientists, and be mentored while applying DNA technologies.

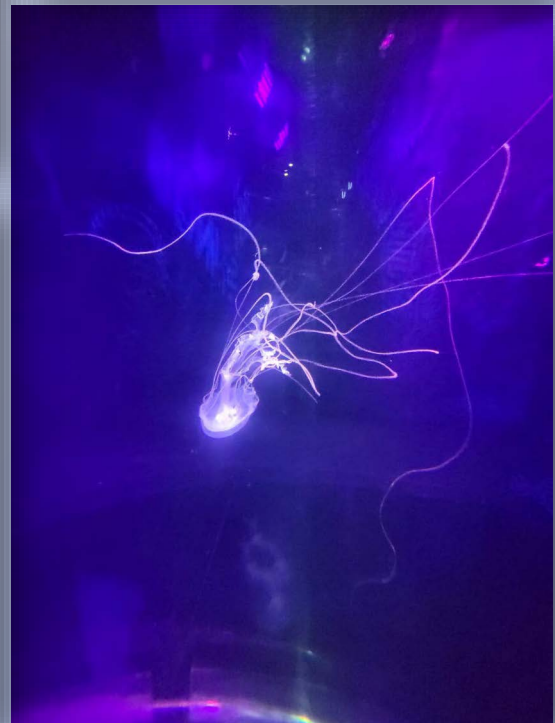
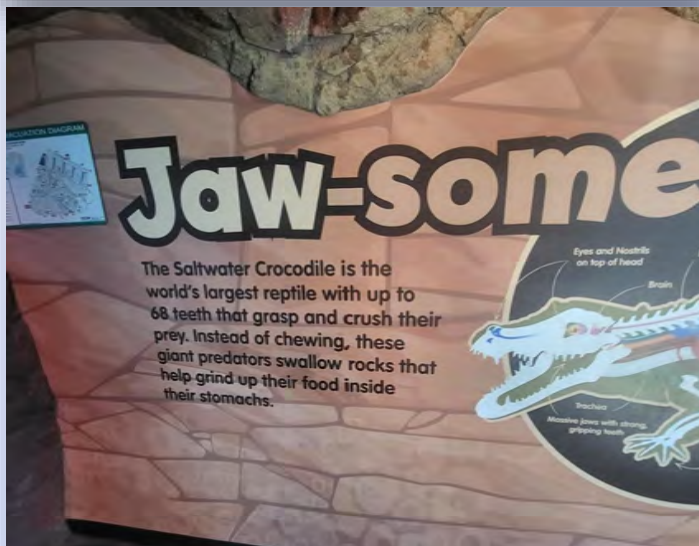
