Year 9/10 Psychology



The brain is one of the most researched parts of the human body, and although there is so much for students to learn about the brain in the Year 9/10 Psychology elective, there is still much more to explore. In Friday's class some students in the Psychology in Action elective dissected a sheep's brain. They

identified the four lobes of the brain. A longitudinal dissection showed the internal structure of the brain; the white matter of the central nervous system in the deeper tissues of the brain and the abundant grey matter of brain tissue.



Thank you to the Clyde Street Butchers for donating the brains to the Science faculty.

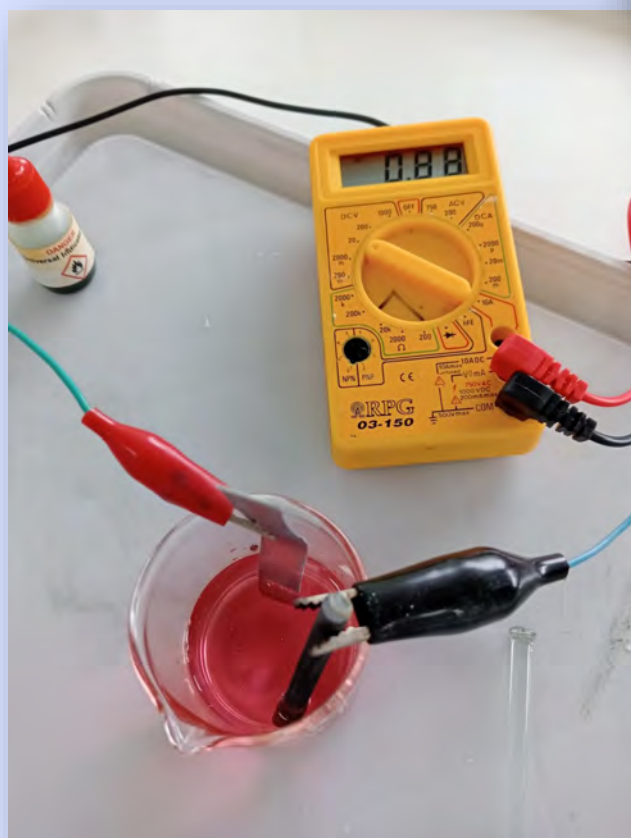

In Year 12 Chemistry, students are investigating the structure of a dry cell battery. They built a model of a battery and measured the voltage produced in the chemical reactions. Students achieved around 1.3 volts, very close to the 1.5V produced by a standard AA battery. Isn't chemistry fantastic?
