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Year 9/10 Psychology



The brain is one of the most researched parts of the human body, and although there is so much for students to learn about the brain in the Year 9/10 Psychology elective, there is still much

more to explore. In Friday's class some students in the Psychology in Action elective dissected a sheep's brain. They

identified the four lobes of the brain. A longitudinal dissection showed the internal structure of the brain; the white matter of the central nervous system in



the deeper tissues of the brain and the abundant grey matter of brain tissue.






Confirmation and Eucharist Masses


